

## Electric Pallet Jack

A lever is responsible for steering the pallet jack and it additionally functions as a pump handle capable of raising the jack. The forks can be lowered back down to the ground by relying on the tiny handle situated on the tiller. This handle releases hydraulic fluid when it is activated. There are front wheels located inside the end of the forks which are mounted on levers. The levers are attached to specific linkages that have their own levers uniting with a cylinder. The hydraulic jack raises at the end with this system as the links force the wheels down. The forks vertically raise above the jacks' front wheels to lift the load up past the floor and for safety reasons, loads are only raised to clear the floor. Usually, pallet jacks have steering wheels located at the front of the machine, while each fork is equipped with a single or double wheel design.
